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Technical Elements

Ride and Relax Bro

Riding with a powder skirt is smart, but rocking one in the cafeteria looks a bit gripped. Ride/relax unsnaps at the back to ease up during lodge breaks or morning dumps.

Tuck and Roll Tab

Pirate pants look stupid. This tuck-and-tab system is a way better way to keep gaiters from tripping you up or dragging in the mud.

Pop and Lock Hem Adjuster

Four inches of lift is what you get when you reach into the pocket and pop this lifter. Lock it in place like a hood cinch to keep hems off the asphalt and out of the muck.

Ease Out Venting

Feeling hot when riding hard is not really cool. To dump heat, sweat and steam, the majority of our styles use pit, hip or inseam vents that let air peacefully flow.

The Z Liner

Most Gore-Tex® shells feel plain on the surface since textured fabrics are hard to certify. The hanging Z Liner allows us to back an exotic fabric with waterproof Gore-Tex®.

Details. Details

Blend is known for style, but we never skimp on detail. Each component, from pockets and hoods to flaps and zips, is pieced out perfectly so you have no need to stress the details.

Custom Kit

A jacket that looks the same sucks, especially if it's the one you just bought. Our styles switch it up with custom options, from removable fur and flash patterns to single-season specialties.

Roll Tape

We know that damp and dank do not make snowboarding more fun. So this season every piece in the Blend line is fully seam taped to prevent leakage and stop seepage.

Sagproof Gaiter

The problem with running 'em low on powder days is snow shooting into the moon. This inverted gaiter pulls up from the pant to stop snow from falling down the drawers.

Jean on Jean

Blend's style and success was built on denim and this season we bring it back as a flavorful option at the 15K and 10K level. Just one warning: jacket or pant only please.

Luxuriality

The Lux Touch Dobby base fabric for our Principal and Nova groups has the coated hand of a luxury feel. Anything else would be uncivilized.

Ladies First

To give the girls what they want we injected ladies-only patterns, softer colors and feminine detailing into the Blend line. No more mistaken gender identity in the park.
